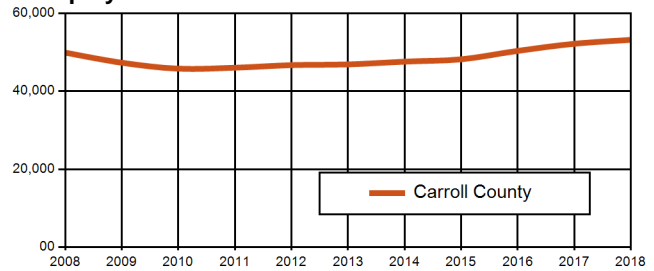

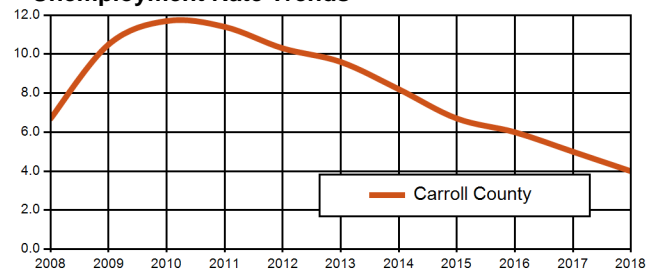

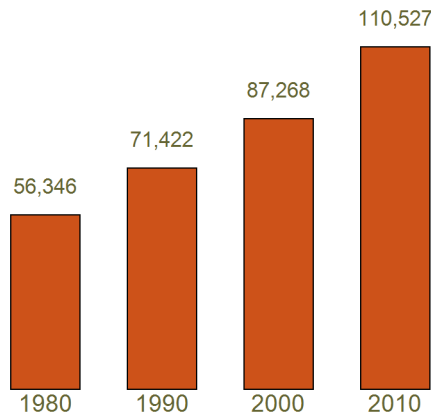
### Unemployment Rate Trends

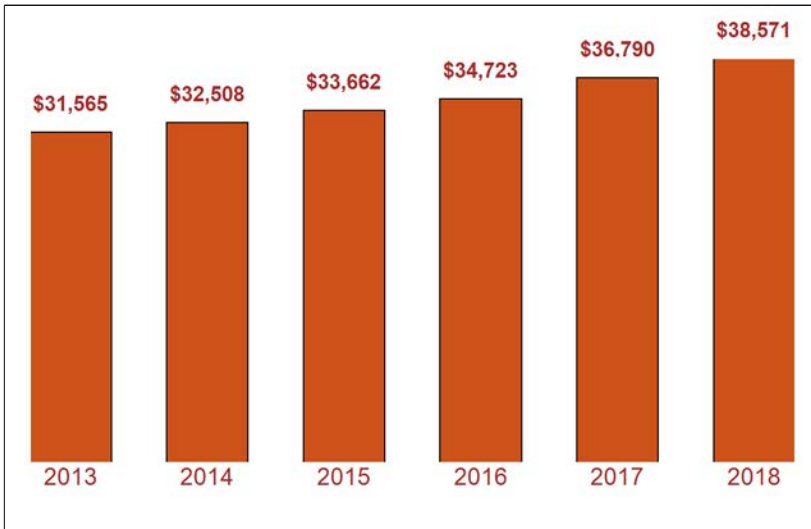

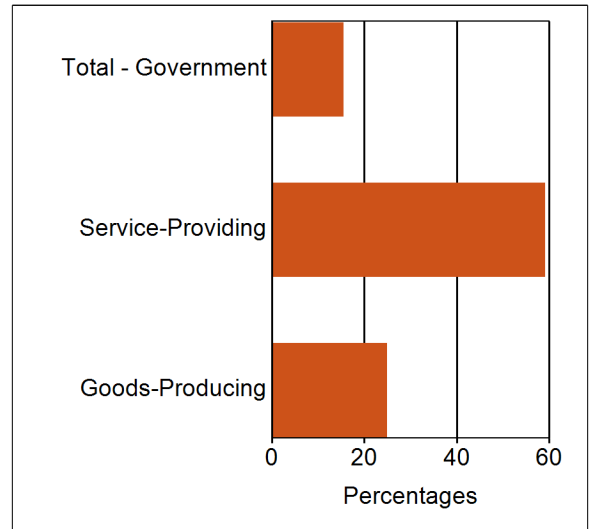
## Carroll Per Capita Income
